

GRADE 7th-12th WBLT Code of Conduct

Being a student at West Branch Learning Tree means you are agreeing to represent our organization to the community at large and abide by our standards for conduct. These standards, taken from our larger handbook, spring from principles of Christian faith upon which West Branch Learning Tree was founded.

In order to foster an atmosphere of encouragement and unity, we expect all students to read thoroughly, agree to and follow this Code of Conduct.

West Branch Learning Tree leaders will also assume the best about each student and will gently address Code of Conduct infractions initially with a discreet verbal warning. If the infractions continue in any of the areas of conduct, further steps will be taken, the last resort being dismissal from the co-op. Code of Conduct violations will be taken into consideration for future involvement with West Branch Learning Tree.

Attitude

-Treat fellow co-op members, including all teachers, helpers and students with respect and graciousness. This would also include the way we treat all staff and members of Friendship Baptist Church.

-Treat WBLT as a high priority. This includes coming to co-op each Monday prepared, completing work when assigned, being on time for class, and being ready to contribute.

- Be receptive and friendly to all students. Refrain from behavior that excludes others or creates divisions.

-Come ready to help where needed.

Speech

-Speak 'Life' – Use language that uplifts and encourages others. Avoid gossip. (Speak about others as if they are part of the discussion.)

-Keep it clean and age appropriate – no profanity (this includes using the Lord's name in vain), and steer away from inappropriate conversations (this includes conversations about sexuality). If an adult asks a student to change the subject, do so.

Behavior

-Represent West Branch Learning Tree well– your social media comments or pictures may directly or indirectly affect West Branch Learning Tree, so keep it positive!

-Be willing to contribute wherever help is needed. This especially included clean up and set up, such as lunchtime and beginning and end of day.

- Avoid public displays of affection between all people: kissing, hand holding, prolonged hugging, etc. are not acceptable during the co-op day.

Dress

Co-op is a learning environment, and the way you dress can be a point of distraction for others. This includes clothing *for both boys and girls*. As a reminder, here is a summary of our dress code:

- Muscle shirts, tank tops, halter tops, and spaghetti straps are not permitted. Shirts should have enough of a sleeve to approach the curve of the shoulder.
- No crop tops (ie, shirts should meet your pants and not show your stomach).
- Clothing that is ripped must not be excessive and must cover appropriate parts of body.
- Showing excessive cleavage will not be tolerated.
- Shorts and skirts must be no shorter than six inches above the knee. Make sure they come down past your fingertips when your hands are at your side.
- No writing on the backside of shorts or pants.
- Stockings or "leggings" are not permissible as pants unless they are covered by a skirt, shorts, or dress that approaches the knees.
- Shoes must be worn at all times, unless requested by teacher, i.e. Tae Kwon Do. (No wheels!)

Conflict resolution

Unfortunately, personality conflicts and misunderstandings can happen. It is important that we respond to these situations, when and if they arise, in a biblical manner (these principles are based on Matthew 18:15-16):

- The offended party must first seek to resolve conflict, in private, between the two parties.

-If either party is unsatisfied or resolution cannot be met, they then need to seek the assistance of an objective party.
